Roanoke Valley Drinking Water Clinic Monday, August 21, 2017

Does your water come from a well, spring, or cistern?

Do you want to learn more about the quality of your water?

How it works:

- 1. At a brief informational meeting, pick up a sample kit and get instructions to collect your household water sample (08/21/17, 6:00 pm, Noel C. Taylor Municipal Building, EOC Room, 1st Floor).
- 2. Collect a sample from your tap at home and complete a short questionnaire.
- 3. Drop off sample at a designated location and time (08/23/17, between 7:30-9:00 am, Noel C. Taylor Municipal Building, EOC Room, 1st Floor).
- 4. About 4 weeks later, come back to get your confidential test results, an explanation of what the numbers mean, and information on how to handle any problems that are present. If you can't attend this meeting on this day, then results will be mailed to you.

Where: Noel C. Taylor Municipal Building, EOC Room, 1st Floor

Cost: \$55 (includes sample analysis cost to test for selected chemical and bacteriological constituents –a \$300 value)
