How it works:

- 1. Pick up your sample kit at the local Extension office with physical distancing measures or request to receive it by mail. We will be offering a **drive-through pick up** at the Brambleton Center between **4-6:30pm on Mon**, **5/23/2022**.
- 2. Collect samples on **Wednesday**, **5/25/2022** and drop off locally at the Brambleton Center (drive through drop off) between **7:30** and **9:00am**.
- 3. Samples are analyzed at Virginia Tech.

 Receive your confidential results, an explanation of what they mean, and information about addressing any problems via email. A recorded video presentation will be available to help you understand your results.

Cost: \$60 (includes sample analysis cost to test for selected chemical and bacteriological constituents –a \$300 value) Please note that financial support is available for individuals/families who may need assistance covering this cost.
